chiefs of the Iowas, and his wife, each
have a child at the Carlisle Indian
school in Penna. and having been absent
from them near one year and a half are
very desirous of going over to see them.
And not being very familiar with the
english language desired the interpreter
to accompany them. They are however
without funds and desired me to write
and ascertain if there was any source
from which they could be supplied with
sufficient for the journey. The expense would
not exceed two hundred and fifty dollars; After
my short residence at the agency I am led to
believe that Kihoga is a worthy character.
