CARLISLE BARRACKS,

Carlisle, Pa., July 9th 1883

To the Hon.

The Com^d of Indⁿ Affs.
Washington D.C.

Sir.

Mannelito Chow, youngest son of Mannelito, chief of the Navajos, is in a critical condition of health, and my physician reports it necessary he be returned to his Agency at once. Francis Co, another Navajo pupil is also reported in a decline, both from Scrophula with tendency to quick consumption.

Eva Rufina a pupil from Isleta N.M. has such constitutional weakness as to discourage further stay at the school, and Edward Myers a Pawnee, has had hemorrhages, which advise his return to his Agency. John Bull a Ponca whose time expired Feb. 20th last, should be returned to his Agency.

I ask authority to send home these several pupils and to pay the necessary travel expense, together

with the expense of one person in charge,
which is rendered necessary by the feeble
condition of four of them.

My physician considers it imperative
Mamelito should go at once, and I
will be favored if I may have telegraph
authority tomorrow fore-noon, so they may
start at 2 o'c P.M.
