Sir:

The Office is in receipt of your letter of the 2d instant, in which you say that DeForrest Billy, a former pupil who deserted from the school May 7, 1904, had a bank account of \$41.99, which was forfeited and turned over to the Emergency Fund on May 18, 1904, and that \$4.00 representing wages which had been credited to him, were also turned over to the same fund on April 11, 1905, and you ask for authority to pay him \$45.99, which represents the full amount of his account, from the Emergency Fund.

You are hereby authorized to draw a check in favor of DeForrest Billy against the Emergency Fund in the sum of \$45.99, attaching a copy of this letter to the voucher on which the payment is shown.

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir:

The records at this school show that De Forrest Billy, of the Seneca tribe, Akron, N. Y., was enrolled as a pupil February 13, 1901, and deserted from the school May 7, 1904. On April 24, 1908, he returned to the school and at his request was readmitted as a pupil. It has since been learned that he has a wife and infant child at Akron, N.Y. He now says he is willing to return and endeavor to provide for them.

The records here show that this young man's bank balance of \$41.99 was, on May 18, 1904, forfeited and turned over to the Emergency Fund, and that on April 11, 1905, the sum of \$4.00, representing wages which had been credited to him, was also turned over to the Emergency Fund. I respectfully recommend that I be given authority to draw a check in favor of De Forrest Billy against said Emergency Fund (of which there is now a balance of \$1202.46) for \$45.99, the amount taken from his account.
