Answering your letter of the 9th instant, concerning the transfer to Carlisle of a Chippewa Indian girl who has been living in the family of Superintendent Lipps of the Fort Lapwai Indian School, you are advised that neither your letter nor Supt. Lipps's gives sufficient information to warrant a definite answer.

The Office should be advised as to the degree of Indian blood of this applicant ; on what reservation she has rights; age ; where she attended school up to this time ; how long ; what grade she attained ; whether she is a graduate of any Government school, etc.

When full information has been received, consideration will be given . If she is over-age, and has any special purpose or course in mind, that should be stated also.
