Sir:

I respectfully submit below a copy of a report made by School Physician A. R. Allen:

"I beg to report that Mabel Hart was admitted to the school hospital July 29, 1910, with an abscess at the juncture of the skull and spinal column. This abscess was deep and involved the bones. It was opened and drained with improvement. About October the third she was put to bed with an increased temperature, and in a few days symptoms of tubercular meningitis developed. She gradually grew worse, becoming unconscious, and died October 17th at one o'clock A. M."

I also beg leave to report to the Office that when the parents of the girl requested that her body be sent to her former home, arrangements were made to do so, and after brief funeral services on the morning of October 18th, such shipment was made.

Mabel Hart was a half-blood member of the Chippewa Tribe, and was enrolled at Carlisle in September of 1908. She was fifteen years of age at the date of her death and her former home was at Pinconning, Michigan.
