I respectfully report that the two boys referred to in communication herewith are Esley Oden and Max La Chapelle, and that they were denied enrolment at Carlisle solely because they have had public school facilities at their home. However, as there is yet room here to accomodate additional students their enrolment can be effected if the Office will waive the Regulations affecting them and I am instructed accordingly. No other students would be deprived of securing an education by the enrolment of the boys.
