In reply to your request of March 13, 1914, for information as to the Chippewa scholarships, you are advised that of the ten scholarships for which money was appropriated, two vacancies yet remain.

As to qualifications of applicants, each is required to furnish a certificate showing that he has completed the work in the grammar grade, or show school credits sufficient to enter the first year of high school. The applicant also must be morally, mentally and physically qualified.


