My dear Mr. Summers:

In reply to your letter of November 7, requesting the return home of your son, Frank, from the Carlisle Indian School, you are informed that the Superintendent advises the Office that your boy was enrolled September 24, 1911, for a period of five years. At the close of this school year his term will have expired and he will then leave the school for his home. Mr. Lipps says he is doing well. It appears that you have misunderstood the term for which he was enrolled. There now remains only a few more months for him to complete his course at Carlisle. Under the circumstances no doubt you will be satisfied to have him remain there uninterrupted until the close of the school year.
