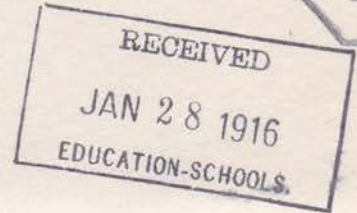

In view of the fact that George H. Mayo, of L'Anse, Michigan, whose desired enrolment at Carlisle is again referred to in the Office's letter of the 20th instant, must be given special permission to come here on account of his previous attendance in the public schools at his home, I believe that he should contribute toward the expense of securing an education by paying for his transportation from his own or his parent's funds. It is recommended, therefore, that if permission to enroll is given him it is with the understanding that he pay for the cost of his transportation.
