I have learnt your intention  
of establishing a school for  
Young Indians at Carlisle, Pa.

I would, respectfully, solicit  
your favor for the purpose of  
being appointed one of the  
teachers. I have been teaching  
ancient and modern languages  
at Dickinson, Williamsport Pa.  
for 8 consecutive years. At the  
latter place I had the plea-  
sure of an introduction to

you by you. W<sup>m</sup>. F. Armstrong  
of Lycoming, during the Greely  
Campaign. Besides linguistic  
ability, my military training  
in Prussia may, perhaps,  
be another point, which will  
fit me for such a position.

If you should think favorably  
in regard to my petition,  
I shall, in a second letter  
give you references and recom-  
mendations. Knowing your  
time to be too occupied for  
reading long letters, I hope  
you will excuse brevity.
