to give them pine nuts.

to them, its useless, nothing
but few timbers and hills. No
water to do any farming. so we
all in families have to work for
the white ranches. But they are well
respected by the white man.

left Carlisle I know that I have

me a long in the wide world

their education. I have learned
the training in the use of certain
tools is fundamental to all education
such as the saw, the square, the hammer
and the plane.
