Sir:

Referring to your letter of the 11th inst., marked "E" in relation to a letter received at your Office from Raymond W. Hewart, expressing his desire to return home this Spring, I have the honor to inform you that on the 15th Jan'y. last, at his own desire and after he had stated that he did not want to return home this year, I sent him to a place in the Country - Bucks Co. - He did very well until quite recently, when he behaved very badly and his employer was compelled to tell him he did not want him any longer. He then left and went to the Educational Home in Philada. I sent after him and brought him to the School. He was tried

and a part of his sentence is that he shall not be allowed to return home this year.

He is not a good boy and never has been in the school; giving more or less trouble throughout his entire course; at one time leading a slight mutiny. His own good and the consequent good of the tribe will be best served by executing the sentence imposed by the Court.
