To the Honorable

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Prof. Bridenbaugh seems especially anxious that two of the girls, who remained back under my agreement with him to help do the work until the other students went home from Martinsburg, should go home instead of coming here. There are special reasons, which I will, if necessary, explain hereafter, why they had better come here, from which point they can go home as well as from Martinsburg. Dr. Given under your authority leaves for Green Bay today, and will give me all the information necessary in regard to these students remaining or going home. I doubt not that he will arrange satisfactory with the parents for every one of the Oneidas.

I have secured tickets and forwarded for the transportation of the four girls still remaining at Martinsburg; and if any decision of the Office in reference to them is necessary I request that it may be instruction to Prof. Bridenbaugh to send the girls here.
