Referring to your instructions concerning employes of last year not reappointed, I have to respectfully advise you that Miss Rachel L. Stanton, teacher, was on an appeal from Supt. Meserve, and her own desire, transferred to Haskell. Miss M. Wood, teacher, leaves the service on account of the prolonged illness of her mother and sister, and the need of her presence at home. Mr. Reighter I have not renominated because his advanced years, 67, are against the best management of our tailoring department. I continue him on the irregular roll for the present at the same pay. I have not yet been able to secure the services of a suitable man for the place. Phil Norman, Bandmaster and painter, has grown so deaf as to be greatly crippled in his work. While I cannot immediately supply his place I have continued him and he is notified, as well as Mr. Reighter, that when I can find a suitable party their services will not be needed longer.
