Sir:-

Replying to your letter of the 25th instant, marked "Education, 34603 - 1897," I have to respectfully advise you that Julia Hand, with the full knowledge and permission of her parents, came to Carlisle from Whites' Institute August 23rd 1895 for our regular term of five years. She is a very nice quiet girl, though not very bright in the school room work. At her own request she remained in the country last winter under our Outing System, where she had the privileges of the public schools until she was taken ill with pneumonia. Fortunately she was in the home of a good physician where she received excellent care and so recovered. She is now at the same country home and is in better health than when she came to Carlisle. The people with whom she is living are much attached to her and give excellent reports of her. As the term for which she came to Carlisle is not out, she is not entitled to return to her home.
