

Replying to yours of the 12th inst. marked "Education", Circular # 27, I have to respectfully advise you that Mr J. Banks Ralston, Asst. Disciplinarian, was appointed by your letter of Sept. 24th last marked "Education 41826." Mr. Ralston has become more familiar with his duties and has grown to fill his place admirably. He is a graduate of Dickinson College with anticipations for advancement, but in a recent conference he agrees to stay another year.

Miss Sadie E. Newcomer, appointed Assistant Teacher, and beginning duty on Jan. 1st, 1899, while not such a teacher as I would have selected or could easily have procured, is among the best we have received through the Civil Service and is developing; so that I should prefer to keep her rather than make a change.
