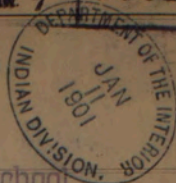

SIR:


I have the honor to transmit an estimate of supplies, etc., required for the service at the agency under my charge, as above, amounting to \$ 462.09, and respectfully ask for the necessary authority to purchase the same¹ in open market

and to make contract with the lowest responsible bidder, or bidders, for the delivery of the articles estimated for.

1. "Under contract," or "in open market."

The application to be made of each article and the necessity for its purchase must be clearly stated in the remarks. Insert extra leaves when the space is not sufficient.
