The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,  
Washington, D. C.

Sir :-

I have the honor to report that there is now at this school a large amount of worn out and unserviceable property which we are anxious to be relieved of. On Sept. 24th the Office in letter marked "Accounts" advised the Superintendent that an inspecting officer would be here within two weeks to look over the property and decide upon its disposition. As explained in letter of Sept. 25th, it was impossible to make a schedule of the articles at that time for the reason that they were scattered in various buildings on the grounds, the addition to the store house not being then completed. The property has since been collected and scheduled and is awaiting the action of an inspecting officer. As it occupies room that is constantly needed and consequently is subject to disarrangement, it is very difficult to keep it in condition to be passed upon. I therefore respectfully request that someone be sent at the earliest date practicable to the end that disposition being made, the property may be removed from our returns and cease to be an incumbrance.
