A STATEMENT of ATTENDENCE in various Government Indian Schools by Edmond Granger of Minneapolis, Minnesota a mixed-blood Indian of the Turtle Mountain Chippewa Tribe for J.B. Bottineau, Solicitor, to secure admission into the Carlisle Government School to complete his education.

Statement: My attendance in the several Indian Schools are as follows:

FIRST: My first attendance was in the Indian School at Pierre, South Dakota. My admission was secured about the Month of February or March 1896 by my Mother, Mrs. Edmond Granger Nee Philomene Delonais, now deceased of Minneapolis, Minnesota, and remained in attendance in that School over three years and was in the 8th Grade and left the School in August 15th or 19th 1899 with leave to go home to my parents in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

SECOND: About the Month of October 1899 at the instance of my Mother through the aid of Mr. Fletcher, Member of Congress from Minnesota, I was admitted into the Carlisle Indian School.

After remaining at the Carlisle School three months, still being in the 8th Grade I left the School on January 5th 1900 with leave to visit my Sister at her request who was very sick at Fall River, Mass. remaining with my Sister until April 7th 1900 during which time I found employment in the Cotton Mills at \$3.50.

and \$4.00. per week and from thence went to Boston for work remaining there until May 6th 1900 mostly employed at driving teams.

THIRD: Upon my Application to the Superintendent of the Indian School at Chilocco, Kansas wherein I have a brother to this day, arriving there and admitted to that school on May 8th 1900. After remaining in that School a year, being then in the 9th Grade on May 19th 1901, I left the School without leave and went roaming the Country about Five Months in search of work taking good care not being detected or captured by the School Authorities, touching and remaining a few weeks at Okalhoma, and a few Months in Kansas City, Kansas and vacinities arriving home at Minneapolis, Minnesota in September 1901.

FOURTH: On February 10th I was taken under the Guardianship of my Sponsor, J.B.Bottineau, the Solicitor above named and came to Washington on the 13th of February and secured my admission in Hilton Public School of the District of Columbia and ever since attended said Public School remaining with and under the Guardianship of my Sponsor, Mr. J.B.Bottineau but now desire to return to the Carlisle Indian School to remain and complete my education.
