To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Sir:

Replying to letter (Accounts 5388-1905), dated the 3d instant, from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, you are advised that the money paid to Superintendent W. C. Kohlenberg of the Sac and Fox school, Oklahoma, for the estate of James Wolf, amounting to \$143.56, by this school was the balance left of this young man's bank account here at the school. The money consisted partly of agency receipts but mostly of earnings of the boy himself here at the school under the Outing System.

We are unable from our records to state the name of the allottee or the number of the allotment from which the rental accrued, in the case of rent moneys received by the young man from the agency.

As most of James's money here consisted of earnings I think the sum remaining at the time of his death might very properly be regarded as wages and that the amounts received by him from the agency were spent by him. No agency money was received subsequent to March, 1904.
