Sir:

Referring to your Office letter (Education 82863/06) dated Sept. 27th directing that John Archuleta be instructed to report for duty to Supt. T. G. Lemmon, Keams Canyon, Arizona, as shoe and harnessmaker at \$300 per annum at the Moqui School, I have to say that this young man left here for Keams Canyon on October 6th. We now have a letter from him from which the following is quoted:

"And when I got to the school I saw Mr. Lemmon the superintendent who said they had a shoe and harness maker already appointed and approved by the Department, so I don't know what I can do--dont know which way to pull off. I have to wait till I get a reply from Washington. I may have to go out tramping."

If the facts are as stated there has evidently been a misunderstanding somewhere, but as this young man went down there in good faith and under proper instructions, it seems only just that he should be taken care of in some way. He is old enough to be earning his own living and is capable.
