I have the honor to state that I am forwarding under the same cover, attached to Report of Changes in School Employes, the resignation of Miss Sara Pierre, an Indian girl, Cook at the Southern Ute School, with the recommendation that it be accepted. She was recently sent here from Carlisle and proved herself very competent, and only resigned on account of solicitations of friends that continue her work of trained nurse. She was offered the position of nurse in the Lawrence General Hospital, Lawrence, Mass., and left this morning to accept it.

She recommends very highly for Cook a young Indian named Louisa French, now at Carlisle School, and if the Superintendent of said school thinks she is competent, I would like to have her, if you have no other plans. If you do not send her I trust you will send a strong, young, and competent, unmarried white woman to fill the position at an early date.
