Sir:

Your letter (Education 15311/07) dated the 16th instant stating that the Secretary of the Interior had been requested to abolish one of the positions of assistant farmer at this school at \$600 per annum and to authorize instead the position of instructor of agriculture at \$1000 per annum is at hand.

In answer to your inquiry as to which one of our assistant farmers we desire to have transferred you are advised that the position which it is intended to abolish is at present temporarily filled by Mr. C. W. Leib, of Carlisle, Pa., and when the position of teacher of agriculture has been authorized the employment of Mr. Leib will be discontinued.

We note what you say to the effect that the Civil Service Commission will likely advertise for an open competitive examination for the position if they do not now have eligibles on the register, and in connection therewith I have to say that we will try and find a suitable man, one who is qualified in every respect for the position and then, if required, have him take the examination. If, however, it can be accomplished in accordance with the Civil

Service rules it is deemed to be most desirable that we should be permitted to assist in the selection of an appointee.
