Sir:-

Answering your Office letter, Education, 26050/1907, in regard to report of farming operations for this school for the calendar year, 1906, you are advised that a fair valuation of the lands comprising our two school farms, exclusive of the building improvements, is about \$70.00 per acre, for 285 acres, - total of \$19950.

There were paid out in rentals for lands during the calendar year, 1906, \$400 for the Henderson tract, and \$400 for the Alexander tract, or a total of \$800 for both tracts.

These items have been added to our inventory and operating expenses in connection with the school farms as instructed.
