My dear Mr. Acheson:

Replying to your letter of September 25, you are advised that the Carlisle Indian School was restored to the War Department on September 1, 1918, for a hospital for soldiers. This was done because this property was originally a military establishment and the Indian Service was allowed the use thereof for a school until such time as it should again be needed for military use. Owing to the necessities resulting from the late war it was so required and upon request of the War Department it was returned to them. It will not be reopened as an Indian school.

Sherman Institute, Riverside, California.
Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kansas.
Chilocco Indian School, Chilocco, Oklahoma.

Albuquerque Indian School, Albuquerque, N. M.
