I respectfully transmit the resignation of William Stimpel, disciplinarian at this school.

I believe if Mr. Stimpel had stayed, he would have become in time a good disciplinarian. However, he has not been able to grasp the idea that he is dealing with a corps of students instead of a company of enlisted men. I could not guarantee him a raise in salary, nor accede to his request that Mr. Wallace Denny, assistant disciplinarian, be relieved.

Mr. Alfred M. Venne has been temporarily placed in charge of the work, pending a permanent appointment. I respectfully request that I be given time to look around and get in touch with a suitable man, who has had actual experience.

Sir:-

In view of the fact that my probationary appointment expires June 15th 1908, and in the event I should be selected for the permanent appointment I beg to state that I cannot accept the position at \$800.00 per annum, if the appointment can be made at \$1000.00 per annum commencing with July first 1908, and further that Mr. Wallace Denny, Assistant Disciplinarian, be relieved from duty in connection with the large boys quarters as I can far better manage the boys and administration of said building to the best interest of the service and the students, I will accept and remain in the Indian Service, if not, I herewith submit my resignation as Disciplinarian of the school, to take effect Wednesday June 3rd 1908.

I do not consider my present pay sufficient for the position especially the nature and length of duty.
