My dear Mr. Clark:-

Receipt is acknowledged of your card of August 9, with reference to enrollment in a Government School. You are advised the Carlisle Indian School will not be reopened by the Government. The Federal Government has not assumed responsibility for the education of New York Indians, nor has it provided schools for them. The State of New York has made provision for the Indians of the State and they are not now admitted to other Indian Schools, but should attend the State public schools or other schools.

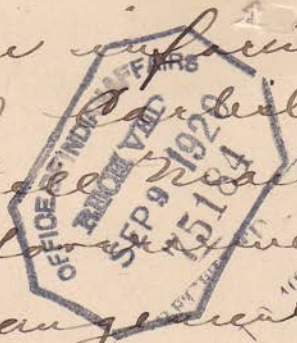
