I respectfully report that Florence Hunter a Sioux Indian who has been a student at this school has been admitted as a student in the Philadelphia School of Pharmacy.

This young lady's home is at Graham's Island, N. Dakota, and she is a member of the Fort Totten Band. She was admitted originally to the school, Dec. 7th, 1906, at the age of twenty years and graduated in April 1908. She worked as a trained nurse in a private family in Philadelphia during the past year from April until June.

Her record while in school has been considered excellent, and I believe that she is well fitted by previous preparatory training and adaptability for the Pharmaceutical career which she has taken up.

Miss Hunter is practically working her way through this college and I am giving her every encouragement and assistance.
