Sir:

I respectfully request that authority be granted me to return Noble Thompson to his home at Laguna, N. M.

This young man was enrolled at Carlisle on Dec. 12, 1904, for a five year term and is now 24 years of age.

I also respectfully report that he has had considerable trouble with his eyes during the last school year and that he has not been able to do any school-room work. During the past week he was examined by Dr. L. Webster Fox, an eye specialist of Philadelphia, who recommends that he should be taken out of school work altogether and that it would be better for him to be allowed to go to work at his home and where such accurate vision would not be required.
