Dear Friend,-

I wish to make a request that you give me authority to permit Robert Jamison a boy of 12 years of age to enter the Carlisle Indian School, I brought the boy to this school and is remaining here, until you notify Supt. Friedman just whatever you decide. Supt. Friedman has explained to me of the new rule in which you do not permit children under 14 years of age to enter this school. I am very anxious that this boy should remain here as a student for his own advantage, He has a home, but his mother has deserted the home, you fully understand that a boy of 12 needs home and care, I will be thankful if you will give Supt. Friedman the authority to permit this boy to this school as a student. Robert's care fare expenses will not come under the expense of the Government.

I remain your friend, Harriet Jamison
