The Office has received your report dated May 16, 1910, relative to the proposed enrollment of F. L. Kern of St. Paul, Minnesota. You say that his application has been received and is satisfactory in every way other than that of age, he having passed 21, and you ask that authority be granted to enroll him.

The letter received from F. L. Kern, dated March 23, 1910, shows that he claims to be a one-fourth Chippewa, to have been enrolled at the Pierre Indian School, South Dakota for a period of four years, that he has two brothers now at Carlisle, and that because of musical ability he also wishes to be enrolled there.

Your letter presents no additional facts concerning him, and the information at hand is not sufficient to justify waiving the age limit. You are requested if you have such further information to forward it for the consideration of the Office.
