As soon as she has fully recovered she wishes to return to the Holy Cross Academy. Miss Fish informs the Office that she has funds of her own sufficient to pay her expenses to Carlisle and that she desires to leave on Saturday.

You are authorized to release her and I have notified the Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School to receive Miss Fish in that institution and to notify you when she is again placed on his rolls.

Sir,

My attention has been directed to an enrolled Menominee Indian girl - Elizabeth Fish now attending school in Washington at the Holy Cross academy.

She has been taking a special course in music and high school work preparatory for teaching. The expense of this she has borne herself although I believe enrolled at Carlisle Indian School. I deem it advisable under present circumstances and particularly on grounds that she needs a rest up from physical and mental strain she has undergone in her work that she be permitted to return to Carlisle until such time as she can again take up her tasks.

She informs me that authorities at the Academy are perfectly willing that such action be taken and asks that a letter be sent to
