
Dear Madam:

Answering your letter of Oct. 28, with reference to your desire to be enrolled at the Carlisle Indian School, Pa., you are advised that the law provides that the general appropriation of funds shall not be used to educate children of less than 1/4 Indian blood whose parents are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they live, and where there are adequate free school facilities provided and the facilities of the Indian schools are needed for pupils of more than 1/4 Indian blood.

The Office is unable to give you the degree of Indian blood of Mary Estes--Diver, for the reason that her name is not found on the last quarterly attendance report from the Carlisle Indian School, and you failed to state where she was enrolled.
