My dear Mr. Secretary:

In the attached letter regarding the desire of the Naval Government of Guam to send to the United States for higher education a limited number of students, it is suggested that the Carlisle Indian School might be a suitable place in which to try out the plan. However, the Carlisle School is of the grade of intermediate and high schools and therefore probably does not carry the grade of work desired. There have been a few students other than Indians admitted to Carlisle in the past, upon payment of their own expenses, which would now be at the rate of \$200 per year in addition to the expense of transportation.

It is suggested that the matter be further referred to the Bureau of Education which may be able to afford some definite information or suggestion as to higher education of these boys and girls from Guam in institutions in the United States.
