Sir:

I enclose herewith communication received by me from Mr. John L. Boyer, Ex-Chief of Police, Carlisle, Pa., in regard to fees claimed to be due him for the arrest of pupils found in the town of Carlisle without permission.

I am advised that it has been customary to require students to pay such fees from their own funds. Upon investigation I find that Jonas Poweshiek and Horace Poweshiek have no funds to their credit in this office; Walter Anderson has \$2.54 to his credit; John Meade has \$25.00 to his credit; and Fred Walker has \$24.80 to his credit.

Inspector Linnen questioned the legality of paying for such services, and I do not feel warranted under the circumstances in requiring the boys mentioned, who have funds, to their credit in bank, to pay these charges without first receiving instructions from your Office. Please advise me regarding this matter.
