To the Hon. Carl Schurz
Secretary of the Interior.

Sir:

On behalf of the Trustees
of this institution I would
respectfully represent that, to
make our work for Indians a
more complete and satisfactory
effort a number of girls be
admitted to their academy here.

The government is now creating
twenty eight (28) Indian boys
and nine Indian girls here at

an annual expense of one hundred and sixty seven (\$67) dollars.

I therefore beg leave to request that twenty (20) Dakota girls from tribes already represented here be sent here to be educated in like manner and at the same expense to the government; that is, one hundred and sixty seven dollars a year apiece, to arrive about the middle of September next.

Should this request be granted I would respectfully suggest that Captain R. H. Pratt be assigned to the duty of securing them and that, should he find it impossible to induce girls to come without a few boys, he be authorized to

bring out our six boys. This
suggestion is made from a knowledge
of Capt. Pratt's views on this matter

To the Hon. Carl Schurz
Secretary of the Interior:

Sir:

On behalf of the trustees of this institution I would respectfully represent that, to make our work for Indians a more complete and satisfactory effort a number of girls be added to those already here

The government is now educating thirty eight (38) Indian boys and nine Indian girls here at

an equal expense apiece of one hundred and sixty seven (167) dollars.

I therefore beg leave to request that twenty (20) Dakota girls from tribes already represented here be sent here to be educated in like manner and at the same expense to the government: that is, one hundred and sixty seven dollars a year apiece, to arrive about the middle of September next.

Should this request be granted I would respectfully suggest that Captain R. H. Pratt be assigned to the duty of securing them and that, should he find it impossible to induce girls to come without a few boys, he be authorized to

bring not over six boys. This suggestion is made from a knowledge of Capt. Pratt's views on this matter.
