[EXTRACT.]

\* \* \* \* \*

2.. Pursuant to instructions from the General of the Army, dated August 22, 1879, the post of Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, will be transferred to the custody and control of the Interior Department, to be used as a school for the education of Indian children; reserving, however, the right of the War Department to resume occupation of Carlisle Barracks whenever needed for military purposes, or when required by Congressional action.

The present commanding officer of Carlisle Barracks, 1st Lieutenant *E. T. C. Richmond*, 2d Artillery, is charged with the execution of the transfer of the post under the above instructions to such officer as may be designated by the Interior Department to receive it. He will take receipts, in duplicate, for the buildings and property transferred, and to that end will at once proceed to make an accurate inventory thereof, noting on the inventory their present condition. Detailed instructions will be issued hereafter in regard to the disposition of the detachment now on duty at the post, and of such public property as it may be necessary to remove therefrom.
