2. To carry out the provisions of paragraph 2, Special Orders No. 52, current series, Headquarters Military Division of the Atlantic, directing, (under instructions from the General of the Army of August 22, and 30, 1879,) the transfer of the post of Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, to the custody and control of the Interior Department, a Board of Officers to consist of—

1st Lieutenant *R. H. Pratt*, 10th Cavalry, (on behalf of the Interior Department.)

will assemble at that post on Saturday, the 11th instant, at 11 a. m., or as soon thereafter as practicable, to appraise the articles of Government property to be transferred from the War to the Interior Department.

The junior member will act as Recorder for the Board.
