It is to be deplored that so many Indians in different sections of the country have become addicted to the use of intoxicants. Just as long as they will not give up the use of liquor they cannot expect to make much progress, and it is only by the Indians themselves that the problem can be solved.

Here the San Carlos Indians or bad Indians is too many Sioux and too many whiskey, on this San Carlos Indian Reservation this got to be stop before made a good Indians out of it,
