yes, I married
the daughter of James Queen, white.

2. What is your present address?

Cherokee N.C.

3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? yes. Give names of schools and dates if possible

I attended the Cherokee Training School the year after I left Carlisle. I don't remember the exact year.

4. What is your present occupation?

I am selling agent for the Singer Sewing Machine Co.

5. Tell something of your present home

I live in what is known as the Guessed Boundary, belonging to the Eastern Cherokees. my home is located 1 1/2 miles from school.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have?

The land which I own is a common share in the above mentioned Boundary. I own a mare & colt, milk cow & calf, five hogs & a five room house & three hundred dollars.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each?

I only served one year as asst. disciplinarian at school the second year I returned home.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

I was Foreman of construction work in building the Soco & Coronado flume for one year.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I married at rather an early age, 18 years old but have never regretted the step, and while I have found life a hard road to travel still I have never said (I can't.) I have five children living, and one dead. My two oldest are attending the State Public School.

I had some trouble in getting my children started in the State school but I finally established my citizenship by paying my poll tax, and complying with the other requirements of a citizen, thereby overcoming the objection to me as an Indian.
