I am doing well in Oklahoma. I have made everything I have. I raise lots of hogs. I have sold them all now. I am going to do it a great deal better. I am going to fix fence and everything. I like to raise hogs but I don't like to handle cows. I used to get mad milking the cows in New Jersey. I used to milk twenty head in one hour by myself. I though I would never have them.

But I am glad I learned to work in Pa. and N. J. because the difference in the work in Pa. and N. J. helps me. I am trying to be good.

I am a Christian man. I don't smoke, drink, whiskey, or play cards or use bad language. I tell the young fols about the best way. We had a good meeting Saturday on my place telling them about God and Jesus. I am glad I wnet to Carlisle and learned lots of things.
