Replying to your letter of June the 16th, in which you again refer to the George Thompson of the White Earth Reservation you desire to locate, this is to advise that the George Thompson who was mentioned in our AEROW some time ago is a member of the Mashpee Tribe of Massachusetts and not the Chippewa you desire to find.

As stated in my former communication our records do not contain the name of a Chippewa Indian who was named George Thompson.
