William Schenandoah Is cruited at Local Station.

## SPECIAL ORDER IS MADE

Oneida Brave Was Rejected When He First Applied, But Officers Secured His Acceptance-Second Indian to Enlist Here.

William Thomas Schenardoah, a big Indian, 27 years old, was enlisted as a machinist's mate, second class, at the local United States navy recruiting station this afternoon. Schenandoan tried to enlist at the recruiting station on March 13th, but he was not admitted. He was eager to join the party so was to the total states.

Schenandoah belongs to the Oneida tribe. His parents live on the Onondaga reservation. His father is a member of the Onondaga's and his mother is an Oneida Indian. The young redskin received his early education at the reservation school. When at the age of 12 years, he was sent to the Carlisle Indian school, where he studied for seven years. He took up a commercial course along with the machinist trade. Schenandoah played left guard on the 1903 Carlise football team. After graduating from Carlisle, he tried entrance examination for Hampton's institute obtaining high marks in all the subjects. He remained there for one year. On returning to this city he secured employment at the Continental Can Works from which company he secured an excellent recommendation.



He visited relatives at the Onondaga reservation two year ago, and it was through his stories of the navy that his nephew decided to enlist. The uncle enlisted during the Spanish-American war, working as a firemen on the New York, Rear Admiral Sampson's flafigship in the battle of San Diego.
