9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I left Carlisle on account of sickness which made me cripple for life but I manage to work alright I went out west in 1898 without any money, to see if I can stand the hard knock of daily life. I stayed with it for ~~to~~ 12 years with out coming home once to see my home & friend. Now Mrs Smith, and I are back on a long visit, and ~~some~~ ^{at} times to be near my ^{sick} mother which I think ^{she} will not last long. As to my living, we eat 3 square meals a day good clothing to wear on sundays, work clothing on work days nice comfortable house to live in, to meet the expence we have ~~we have~~ horses & cattle to sell. we farm out land. we have pigs & chicken and milk cows. we don't lay round nor killing ourself waiting. if anything is going on that is interesting and Respecting we go and take it in. above all my object in life is to be good and honest that when I die to leave a good name behind.
