Mr. Friedman, don't for a minute think that we would fail to defend the school. The last party that left Keshena was due mostly to us - I showed the girls pictures of the school and told them of the opportunities and the many pleasures the students are given - The result was many girls wanted to go but the parents refused -

Some of the girls as well as older people, give Geo. and I as examples of Carlisle students and what it can do for them - I appreciate the honor and hope we fully deserve it -

I have two dear little children, and nearly every one says they are the best little children and so well behaved -

As you know Maude Cooke applied to re-enter the school - I wrote her many a letter begging her to do so, till finally she did so - We have no father and our mother is almost an invalid she wanted to take care of her, & not go to school - Before she consented to go to Carlisle I promised her that I would get mother & take care of her in my home - I would like very much to have Maude spend

the coming summer with us - I would certainly see that she was back to school when it opens - I'll also try & get a couple of new students to go - Maude I think is a good girl at school & would have nothing to go against her - Of course if there is, in the mean time, we shall expect to be disappointed.

I shall be most grateful to you - Before I close I want to tell you that Agnes Wapans wrote to Jane Isham asking her to send a false telegram, to get her home so she might marry some man she named. I told Jane I would write & tell you, so she may not do it -

She was telling me that is how she got home - I know her mother was not ill then -

She confided to me that it was the only means the girls had of getting home -
