have been an assistant 2 years, was in sewing-room and also helped the matron. I was promoted to position of Laundress at \$500. per annum, held this position one and a half years and resigned. I was employed in the Yankton boarding school.

Soon after my return from school, I was given the position as Normal teacher in the Episcopal Mission School for boys here, was there 2 years -

I wish to inform you that all the returned students are doing well on this reservation, under present circumstances, all try to live up to what Carlisle teaches.

I was at Carlisle only a short time, was hindered of the opportunity of completing my education or term there, which I have regretted very much. But I am always delighted or take a great deal of pride in telling that I have been at Carlisle School.

I still correspond with my country people who live in Jenkins town, Pa. - they are Mr. & Mrs. H. W. Noble - very nice people too they are still interested in me; I delight to hear from them, and their letters are instructive as well as a pleasure to me.
