on Wednesday. Joe was
hurt very badly. his head

his mouth was all out of its place. his neck is broken and collar bone and I think is back to, but any way his rippers were broken to. well he was hurt very badly indeed. But Willie Beru he is around here yet. they have'nt put him in prison yet. but they are watching for him just the same. he was killed at the station and after he was dead they took him ~~and it to~~ ^{about a half} mile and put him under the bridge in a river his head was sticking out ^{on} one side of his body in the whole length any way and was found by a little girl and her mother
