2. What is your present address? Cherokee N.C.

3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? No Give names of schools and dates if possible

4. What is your present occupation? House keeping

5. Tell something of your present home. My present home is not as good as I have had. We had a very nice home at first but lost it by fire and have not built since but expect to soon.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have? We own 13.2 acres of land and have 2 cows which more than supplies us with butter & milk and have some hogs.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? I was Assist. seamstress for a year and a half in Cherokee School. Have since taught district school and also taught a 7 months school for the Catawbas where we lived for a year and a half.



8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?.....

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

My husband has always been the one to work and make a living for us. He has held several positions in the school (via) gardener, policeman, night watchman and electrician and he is at present night watchman and he always works a farm and has plenty of vegetables, poultry, eggs, etc. As to stock we do not keep any more than is necessary for our needs as there is no place around here where we can sell butter or milk.

We try to show by our living that our education has not been in vain.

We have 4 children which we are trying to bring up in the way they ought to be brought up.

We have lost several times that which we had gained by hard labor. Our home was burnt to the ground and in the ~~spring~~ summer of 1908 lost our entire crop by water in D.C.
