and ex-students of Carlisle are not going back to the reservation but are taking up the matter of earning a livelihood in white communities on the outside. A recent letter from William White, a Digger Indian and ex-student of the school, informs us that he and his wife, also an ex-student, are living in Walworth, Wis. They have permanently settled in that locality. Mr. White owns his own blacksmith shop and seems to be getting along prosperously. 1910

In a letter to a friend Mr. and Mrs. William White state that they are well and enjoying the social life of the neighboring country of Walworth, Wisconsin. William and his wife were honorable students while here at Carlisle. We are always glad to know of graduates and ex-students who are making progress in the out-world. They are the only Indians who have settled in that locality and have made many friends, judging from the reports which have lately reached Carlisle.

William White, an ex-student of Carlisle and an up-to-date blacksmith in southern Wisconsin, is getting along well in spite of the difficulties which confronted him before he got well started in business. 1909

We learned through a letter that William White, a former student of Carlisle, is getting along nicely at his new home in Wadsworth, Wisconsin. He has a blacksmith shop there and plenty of work. 1909

We are glad to learn of the prosperity of William White, who is now living in Walworth, Wisconsin, where he is following his trade of blacksmithing. 657 -1911.
