The training at Carlisle is beneficial if one can only rely on them after leaving school. True there are times in school when some things required of students seems unnecessary and difficult to follow the instructions; but just as the vowels are necessary to the alphabet, so are the requirements and instructions, to the student, necessary in life. Thus far, I can only say that I have used various stepping stones to cross the streams, many of which are threatening, of life.
